WACD will be hosting a tribal/conservation district training session on May 23 in Ellensburg. **Policies** Policy updates will be identified and updates brought back to the Board by the end of 2017. **Building and Office Space** Ryan Williams discussed the current status of the building acquisition opportunity. Financial institutions will be engaged to identify loan options. Karl Hereth moved to advance the offer of \$1,650,000 for the building at 114 Avenue C in Snohomish.
