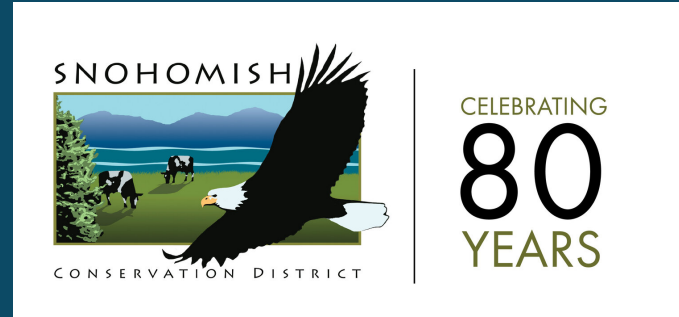

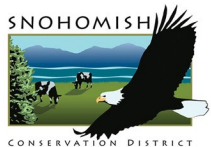

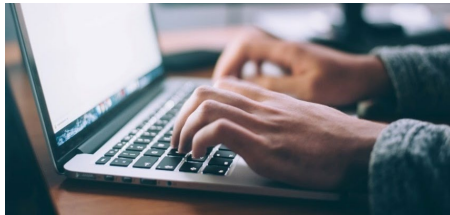

What Is A Conservation District?

- Free technical assistance and financial assistance to land managers in Snohomish County and Camano Island
- Work with rural and urban residents to improve habitat, soil health, productivity, resiliency, and water quality through Best Management Practices (BMPs)
 - Pasture, weed, mud, and manure management, soil health
 - Low Impact Development (LID) – rain gardens, cisterns, bioswales
 - Habitat restoration, riparian and working buffers, forestry planning
 - Agriculture resilience and urban agriculture
 - Youth & Adult Education

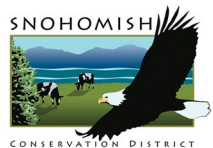
