1" rain event = 596 GALLONS


37"a year = 22,117 GALLONS




COMBINED sewer and storm system




Benefits of a rain garden




- reduces property flooding

- increases habitat
























Rebate basics

To qualify for a rebate up to \$2,500, you must

- 1. site assessment with city staff
- 2. perform a soil infiltration test
- 3. rain garden design/planting plan
- 4. city inspection of installation

Site assessment

YOUR responsibility

- 1. Call City to schedule site assessment.
- Have a decision maker at scheduled assessment.
- 3. Call 811. Utilities marked PRIOR to assessment.
- 4. Observe movement of water.

DURING assessment, city staff will

- 1. take pictures,
- 2. look at downspouts,
- 3. measure area, and
- mark locations for soil infiltration tests.

AFTER site assessment, you will

1. Perform soil infiltration tests at chosen spots.
